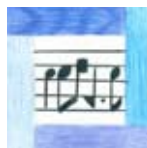

Now stills the lark his festive lay, and mourns with me the dying day. While in the south the first faint star lifts to the night its silver face, and twinkles to the moon afar across the heaven's graying space. Low murmurs reach me from the town, as Day puts on her sombre crown, and shakes her mantle darkly down.

A Girl's Garden

(Robert Frost)

A neighbor of mine in the village likes to tell how one spring when she was a girl on a farm, she did a childlike thing. One day she asked her father to give her a garden plot to plant and tend and reap herself, and he said, 'Why not?' In casting about for a corner he thought of an idle bit of wall'd-off ground where a shop had stood, and he said, 'Just it.' And he said, 'That ought to make you an ideal one-girl farm, and give you a chance to put some strength on your slim-jim arm.' It was not enough of a garden, her father said, to plough; so she had to work it all by hand, but she don't mind now. She wheel'd the dung in the wheelbarrow along a stretch of road; but she always ran away and left her not-nice load. And hid from anyone passing. And then she begged the seed. She says she thinks she planted one of all things but weed. A hill each of potatoes, radishes, lettuce, peas, tomatoes, beets, beans, pumpkins, corn and even fruit trees. And yes, she has long mistrusted that a cider apple tree in bearing there today is hers, or at least may be. Her crop was a miscellany when all was said and done, a little bit of ev'rything, a great deal of none. Now when she sees in the village how village things go, just when it seems



to come in right, she says, 'I know! It's as when I was a farmer -- ' Oh, never by way of advice! And she never sins by telling the tale to the same person twice.

They say I should marry; but I don't want a husband, no! I would rather live secure and as I please in this mountain, than to take a risk as to whether I will be happy in marriage or not. Mother, I will not marry, so as not to have a dull life, or perhaps waste the gifts that God has given me. Such a man will not be born, nor has he been, who is to be my husband; as I know that I am the flower of the girls.

Amazing Grace

(John Newton, 18th century)

Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now am found, was blind, but now I see. Through many dangers, toils and snares, I have already come. 'Tis grace hath brought me safe thus far, and grace will lead me home. When we've been there ten thousand years, bright shining as the sun. We've no less days to sing God's praise than when we first begun.

CATHERINE FAGIOLO, CONDUCTOR

Catherine Fagiolo is founding artistic director of Three Rivers Chorale. She also maintains a private piano and voice studio in Fair Oaks, California.

Ms. Fagiolo has been a founding instructor at Folsom Lake College, where she formed and directed the Choral Union. Ms. Fagiolo has also served as cantor and choral associate for Dr. Donald Kendrick at Sacred Heart Church in Sacramento. She has sung with Sacred Heart's Schola Cantorum for liturgies, concerts, recordings, and tours in North America, England, and Spain.

Catherine Fagiolo has taught choral music at Elk Grove High School where she initiated a choral outreach concert series presented by her ensembles to elementary school audiences. Her choirs have been recognized for excellence at local and regional choral festivals. Students from her choirs and private studio have sung in the National Honor Choir of the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA) and in California All-State Honor Choirs.

Ms. Fagiolo holds degrees from Brown University and from the University of Oklahoma, where she studied with Dennis Shrock and taught music theory. She also earned a California teaching credential at the University of California, Davis.

She served as music director for churches in the Sacramento area from 1987 until 2004. She is active as an adjudicator and guest conductor for choral festivals in the region.

Ms. Fagiolo is a frequent choral accompanist with regional honor choirs for the California Music Educators Association, American Choral Directors Association, and San Joaquin County, and she has accompanied the SUCCEED youth choir in the Roman Catholic diocese of Sacramento.



JASON SIA, ACCOMPANIST

Jason Sia received his musical education at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music and his Bachelors and Masters degrees in Piano Performance at California State University, Sacramento, where he graduated cum laude and received the Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi, Phi Kappa Lambda, Golden Key National Honor Society, CSUS Senate Scholarship Award, and the Festival of New American Music Award. He has attended Aspen Music Festival and School, and performed for master classes of classical pianists of international repute. He is also the accompanist for the Sacramento Valley Concert Choir, and is currently teaching piano at St. Ignatius School, St. John Vianney School, and Northridge Music Center.

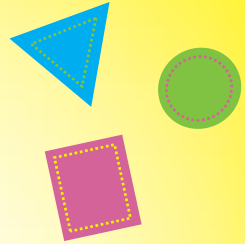
